SUMMER FLYOUT
Dayton, OH June 13-16, 2019**

With so many historic and fascinating venues in the Dayton area, USPA members will have a busy time getting around to experience as many as possible.

To start our educational and fun weekend, we will have a safety seminar at 7:00 p.m. on **Thursday evening, June 13**, at (KMGY) Dayton-Wright Brother Airport at Aviation Sales, Inc. (our FBO, offering free tiedown with a fuel purchase).

Friday, June 14, we will tour the Hartzell Propeller manufacturing plant to learn more about how this vital aircraft component is made. **Hartzell Propeller** was founded in 1917 by Robert N. Hartzell as the Hartzell Walnut Propeller Company. It is an American manufacturer of composite and aluminum propellers for certified, homebuilt, and ultralight aircraft, also producing spinners, governors, ice protection systems, and other propeller controls. After a 45 minute drive to Piqua, Ohio, we will have a three hour guided tour of the plant.

Friday afternoon we will visit the Wright-Dunbar Interpretive Center where there is information about all the Wright sites throughout the Dayton area known collectively as the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park. At the Center we will learn where three historical figures' lives intersected: Wilbur Wright, Orville Wright, and Paul Laurence Dunbar. A guided tour can be arranged, or you can tour on your own.

Friday evening we will eat together and enjoy a presentation by guest speaker Master Navy Diver Ray Davison, as he tells us about helping in the recovery of the NASA Challenger Space Ship disaster, as well as the recovery of the Civil Warship U.S.S. Monitor.

Saturday we will spend the day enjoying the enormous National Museum of the United States Air Force. A guided tour can be arranged, or you can tour on your own. The National Museum of the United States Air Force (formerly the United States Air Force Museum) is the official museum of the United States Air Force located at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, six miles northeast of Dayton. The NMUSAF is the oldest and largest military aviation museum in the world, with more than 360 aircraft and missiles on display. The museum draws about one million visitors each year, making it one of the most frequently visited tourist attractions in Ohio.

Airport and FBO: Dayton-Wright Brothers Airport (KMGY) is our airport, and Aviation Sales, Inc. is our FBO. They are offering no charge for tie-downs with a fuel purchase. You may want to bring your own tie-down ropes just in case they run out of space with ropes.
